


Q1 Does your state require a commercial applicator's license for 25(b) products?

1	Typically, in Florida no license is required but it ultimately depends on the product itself and the application site. The answer will depend on the application site/type of job. If this is being done under Ch. 487 Florida Statute in an agricultural setting, no license will be required. This is because a Ch. 487 license is only needed if restricted use pesticides will be applied. 4	Washington State requires a commercial applicator license for any individual engaged in the business of applying pesticides. (Pesticides, as defined by state law, is "(a) Any substance or mixture of substances intended to prevent, destroy, control, repel, or mitigate any pest; (b) Any substance or mixture of substances intended to be used as a plant regulator, defoliant or desiccant; and (c) Any spray adjuvant as defined in RCW 15.58.030."	8/25/2020 4:32 PM
5	Indiana requires a pesticide applicator license for 25(b) products in any instance where a license would be required for a Section 3 product	8/25/2020 11:50 AM
6	What we require is that companies who conduct pest control for hire get licensed with the Department.
