

# Our Approach: Appropriations and Reauthorization

- Work to increase annual appropriations for OPP
- Craft a PRIA 6 reauthorization bill that builds on the process improvements in PRIA 5 and includes adequate resources for OPP



# EPA Office of Pesticide Programs Funding

- **PRIA Requirement and FY 2027 Coalition Request: \$166 million**

Environmental Programs and Management Account	\$147.1 million
Science and Technology account	\$5.9 million
State and Tribal Assistance Grants account	\$13 million

<b>TOTAL REQUESTED OPP FUNDING</b>	<b>\$166 million</b>

- **FY 2026 Appropriations: \$134.475 million**
- **FY 2025 Appropriations: \$134.275 million**



# PRIA 6 Goals

- Clean reauthorization free of non-germane policy issues
- Ensure that EPA has the resources and enacts the needed technology and process efficiency improvements to meet statutory deadlines for both PRIA and non-PRIA actions
- Continue to refine EPA processes to ensure that PRIA and non-PRIA actions are processed in a timely manner and that the remaining backlog is eliminated
- Utilize technology and training to ensure that regulatory decision making is transparent and consistent across all OPP divisions

# PRIA 6 Reauthorization Timeline

- Reauthorization of PRIA 6 in 2026
- Reauthorization for 7 years



# Predictable PRIA Timelines – Essential Concepts

- Digital labeling
- Technology improvements
- Reduce the burden on EPA
- Allow EPA to reject poor quality submissions
- More accountability around PRIA timeframes
- Ensure that OPP has adequate staffing, resources, and the organizational structure to meet deadlines
- Create more transparency around regulatory processes and decision making
- Consolidate PRIA codes
- New/better incentives for reduced risk(RD)/low risk (AD) products
